MAC provides leadership development opportunities for students, residents, faculty and staff through multicultural, competence-based events and programs.

From power and privilege to belonging and inclusivity, MAC programs aid in better navigating a diverse community. MAC partners with Health Spectrum Alliance (HSA), our LGBTQI organization; BNGAP (Building the Next Generation of Academic Physicians) organization; and the Student National Medical Association (SNMA) to build connections through social justice programming and co-sponsorships at the School of Medicine and the larger Huntington area.

MAC participates in planning programs such as diversity and inclusion town halls, diversity trainings, simulations, annual civility lectures and assists with Office of Diversity & Inclusion pathway programs—Project PREMED; Health Care Pathway Initiative (HCPI) and Pre-Medical Mentoring and Advising Program (PMAP).
