MEDICINE-PEDIATRICS RESIDENCY PROGRAM

Overall Educational Goals

The Medicine-Pediatric Program's overall mission is to maintain and improve the health of children and adults in West Virginia and surrounding communities by educating and graduating resident physicians skilled in the practice of pediatrics and medicine.

Educational Goals & Objectives:

Facilitate each resident's growth as an individual and as a practicing physician by following the guiding values and principles of:

- commitment to life-long learning
- practicing medicine with integrity
- advocating for patients at all times
- promoting independence while encouraging teamwork
- participating actively in the community
- embracing diversity of culture and spirituality
- balancing personal and professional lives

The residency program shall accomplish its goal by striving to train caring, compassionate physicians who are competent to provide the highest level of primary medical care for neonates, infants, children adolescents, and adults, who are advocates for children, adults and their families in terms of social, emotional and medical needs and who have the requisite medical and scientific background to pursue careers in their chosen area of internal medicine and pediatric medicine.

To achieve this goal, the program has the following specific objectives:

- Recruit highly qualified medical graduates to the Medicine-Pediatric Residency.
- Foster critical thinking based on medical and scientific data and provide the educational tools required for the residents to continue to acquire knowledge.
- Provide an environment that encourages initiation of, and participation in, research projects.
- Provide a curriculum of fundamental information concerning normal growth, development and physiology, and methods of diagnosing, preventing and treating disease.
- Supervise, monitor, and facilitate the learning process to assure residents are prepared to achieve their life goals in internal medicine and pediatrics.
- Define specific knowledge, skills, and attitudes required, and to provide educational experiences
 as needed, in order for residents to demonstrate the six Core Competencies as defined by the
 Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education.
