

Update on Honors/Pass/Fail grading scheme for third and fourth year Clerkships

The new Honor/Pass/Fail Clerkship grading system took effect at the start of the fall semester 2015. The process is working well, but is likely to require some tweaks here and there. Currently, the grading scheme affects the third-year required rotations, but will be adopted for the fourth-year electives and sub-internships in the fall of 2016.

New Initiatives Corner Implementation of rigorous exam question review process

The JCESOM has moved to adopt a more stringent question review process in order to ensure that multiple choice questions used in first and second year exams meet stricter standards. The newly implemented review process is as follows: all MCQ used in each exam will be evaluated based on their performance values (p-value) as well as their point-biserial correlation coefficient. Questions that do not meet defined cutoffs will now undergo revision. Our ultimate aim is to ensure that our questions are fair and that they discriminate knowledge appropriately and that the exams meet national standards.

Pediatrics
